We are excited that you have signed up for **Family Camp August 8 – 14** at Camp Galilee and we are looking forward to spending the week with you. During the session your family will have opportunities to kayak on the lake, hike in the woods, play outdoor games, and hear stories around the camp fire. The Rev. Helen McPeak, of Church of the Epiphany, Henderson, as well as Stefani Schatz and Joe Duggan of Trinity and St. Stephen's, Reno will provide the morning program for the adults, while the camp staff works with the children and youth. Come with lots of energy and ideas, a desire to share and learn with others, and enthusiasm for building lasting friendships!

On August 14th of Family Camp 2010, Camp Galilee will be celebrating its 90th anniversary. The celebration will begin at 2:00 PM and last until 8:00 PM, with a barbecue dinner offered at 6:00 PM. You are invited to stay for this wonderful occasion. Overnight accommodations on Saturday night are available. Refer to the 90th Anniversary flyer available on the website for further information. Register soon for overnight accommodations as space is limited.

Here are some things to know before coming to camp.

- * Camp Galilee will provide an afternoon snack as part of the camp cost. Sweatshirts and other clothing will still be sold during the session.
- * Camp Galilee will again provide a camp photo as part of the camp cost.
- * **Change for 2010: registration will start at 3:00 PM on Sunday August 8th.** The program begins with dinner that evening, although the waterfront will be open Sunday afternoon. Check out time is 9:00 AM the following Saturday. Camp Galilee is a closed camp during the session and visitors are not encouraged.
- * Lake Tahoe can have cold weather all summer long, although most of the days are warm and the nights cool. Please come prepared for warm or cold weather.

INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

NEW ADDRESS: The registration office has been moved to Camp Galilee. The camp address is PO Box 236, Glenbrook, NV 89413. The phone number is (775) 749-5546.

FINAL BALANCE is due two weeks before the session. You can pay on-line or send a check to: Camp Registrar, PO Box 236, Glenbrook, NV 89413.

CABIN REQUESTS: If your family has a cabin in which they would like to stay, please contact the camp registrar directly. Please also indicate whether you would be willing to share with another family.

PLEASE DO NOT BRING any pets, skateboards, bikes, and scooters. Camp Galilee is a non-smoking facility.

NUTRITIOUS AND TASTY MEALS and snacks are provided at camp. It is not necessary to bring any food with you.

VALUABLES should be left at home. Camp Galilee is not responsible for lost items.

CANCELLATIONS: If you must cancel, please contact the registrar as soon as possible. Cancellations made by phone must be confirmed in writing.

1. Received at least 14 days before the start of the session: receives full refund less \$50.00 handling fee.
2. Received 2-13 days before the session: receives 50% refund.
3. Received less than two days prior to the session: receives no refund except in medical emergencies when a full refund will be given, minus the \$50.00 handling fee.
4. There is no refund for families who leave during the session.

LATE ARRIVALS and early departures from Camp are discouraged. Campers who must arrive late and/or leave early will be expected to pay the full weekly camper fee. These individuals must notify the registrar in writing one week prior to the beginning of camp, stating the exact time and date of arrival or departure if other than at regularly scheduled times.

MINORS (under 18 yrs. of age) must be accompanied by a parent or responsible adult camper. Parents and/or designated adult campers are responsible for the care and supervision of all minor campers. The Galilee staff will provide activities for children and youth campers during the morning adult program and at various times through the rest of the day.

PROGRAM for the families is provided throughout the week and you are encouraged to participate. Everyone will have an opportunity to choose what programs will be offered during the session. There will also be plenty of free time for relaxing by the lake, walking in the woods, or just quietly reading a book.
