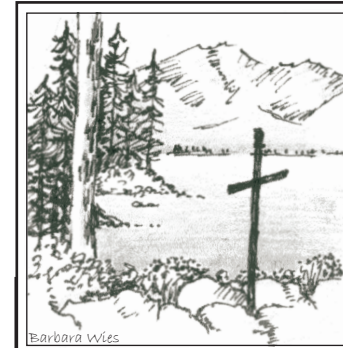
Resident Director Jason shares...

Early in the winter when the water levels were low in the great lake because of the fifth year of the drought, it created various pools or isolated pockets of water among the rocks on Galilee's private shore. These reflection pools made amazing pictures at sunset time and some of those photographs will be available for sale in the camp store this summer. With this winter's abundant snowfalls and recent rains, those reflection pools have been filled in by the welcome spring run-off, all but disappearing with the constant changing of the Tahoe shoreline.

This year is shaping up to be as successful as last year. Almost 2,000 people spent 4,643 "bed nights" at Galilee and Chef Mitch served approximately 9,500 meals. We are always glad to have groups return to enjoy Galilee and become "official" Galileans and we look forward to seeing them at Galilee again. This year, it has been especially great to have several very special confirmation weekends for hundreds of high school catholic teens. Groups from St. Teresa of Avila Catholic Community in Carson City, Bishop Manogue High School in Reno, St. Gall Catholic Church in Gardnerville and Immaculate Conception Church in Sparks were heartily welcomed to Galilee. The combination of St. John's Church and Galilee's environment seems to make these sacramental rites even more meaningful to the teens.

The next time you come to Galilee, look for the bright yellow highway signs indicating you are approaching a side road. Beneath that will be a sign saying "Galilee & St. John's". As you turn into Galilee, you will note that NDOT (Nevada Department of Transportation) and TRPA (Tahoe Regional Planning Agency) have declared our roadway into the property "a street". We have named it, "Galilee & St. John's Circle". A circle represents unity and Galilee's and St. John's relationship demonstrates unity.

Another Great Year at Galilee!

After a record year for revenues, the completion of the Memorial Stairs to the beach, the removal of the steel pilings from the lake and numerous other property improvements, 2004 was indeed a **great year** for Galilee. With the expertise added to our new Board of Trustees members, we anticipate continued success in 2005. Other than continuing our focus on providing memorable experiences for our summer campers and for our conference attendees during the rest of the year, our facility goals for 2005 include completing Frensdorff House and installing fences on the north and south boundaries.

New projects to be completed before Summer Camp opens in June are to relocate the camp store to Hunting Lodge and to remodel Delmar House, the former store. When finished, Delmar will accommodate five adults and sport an updated bathroom. With these additional five beds and adding bunk beds in the lower level of Bishop's House, we will increase bed capacity by 10. Also, the Bishop's House is scheduled to get a new propane water heater and central heat.
